Jamie Thom began his career as a mechanical engineer before turning to his passion for wildlife and photography. In 1995 he took a post as a game ranger and assistant manager at MalaMala Game Reserve in South Africa where he had the opportunity to shoot wildlife on a daily basis. Within a few years Jamie had won a number of awards for his work, his most notable achievement was winning the BBC/Natural History Museum Wildlife Photographer of the Year, the most coveted title in wildlife photography internationally. He also won the Eric Hosking Award (Best portfolio) in the same competition for two years running as well as a number of Agfa Top50 awards.

After 4 years of living at Mala Mala he joined an American company filming and directing wildlife documentaries for National Geographic and Discovery Channel. He filmed a documentary on man-eating lions, filmed and directed two movies; one on cheetah and another on man-killers, (large mammals that kill man). Ultimately he turned back to his passion for still photography and travel. Since 2003 he has been guiding and creating safaris throughout Southern and East Africa for select individuals and groups of clients. His adventures and experiences in the documentary industry, and subsequently as a private guide, have led him to the furthest regions of South Africa as well as Botswana, Namibia, Zambia, Tanzania, Zimbabwe, Uganda, Rwanda, Kenya, Malawi and Madagascar.

Jamie has always had a passion for conservation and it now forms a key element to his service. He personally supports a number of projects and infuses conservation into his trips by promoting providers who are pro-active and who care for local communities. Jamie is 42 years old, married and has two young children.
